



# JBL LSR Series

## LSR4328P/PAK

For starters, JBL's new LSR4300 Series Monitors give the audio world a whole new perspective. LSR – It means “Linear Spatial Reference”. As noted on JBL's website:

*“The Linear Spatial Reference (LSR) philosophy is based on a set of design goals that carefully control the overall performance of the system in a variety of acoustic spaces. Instead of focusing on a simple measurement such as on-axis frequency response, JBL measures systems in a field 360 degrees around the speaker and engineers the entire system to ensure off-axis response reflected to the mix position is also smooth and accurate.”*

All the mumbo-jumbo essentially means that the sweet spot or mix position of these monitors is much larger than their competition. This will allow you to be able to enjoy your mixes at a variety of different locations within the stereo field.

One of the most appealing things about these speakers is not actually a technical specification like most would think. The fact of the matter is you can listen to the JBL LSR4328P for hours without ever fatiguing your ears. Other competing speakers seem to be harsh to the ear, only allowing the listener to enjoy them for a short period of time or only at a low volume.

Another thing that I found appealing in regards to the speakers was that they are clean and accurate. I heard elements in my personal mixes that I had never heard before. The monitors have such a flat response it's unbelievable. To find a great set of studio monitors at this price-point is difficult but JBL is sure on their game.

### **Helpful features you may not have considered:**

The LSR4328P has multiple inputs that are selectable on the speaker, by the JBL Control Center Software (Mac/PC), or by the handy-dandy remote control that ships with the PAK. This gives the user the ability to hear back multiple digital sources (AES/EBU, S/PDIF) and one analog source (XLR or 1/4" TRS). Think of it as putting a whole studio monitoring system at the palm of your hands, without sacrificing the unnecessary additional dollars.

As I mentioned earlier, you can control each individual speaker in your system with the JBL Control Center Software available for Mac or PC (and yes Intel Based Macs too!). You may be wondering that if I am sending digital signal to my monitor, how I would adjust the volume of my speakers. It's quick easy actually; the LSR4328P has its own independent volume control. Now you are thinking, well won't I have to adjust each individual speaker to my desired volume? Wrong!! The HiQnet™ connections allow you to control the master settings for your entire system.

With all the features available to me I didn't expect to find a phenomenal sounding monitor. I was surprised to find one the most comfortable and accurate monitors on the market.
